An Act to protect victims of coercive control.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. (a) Section of 1 of Chapter 209A of the General Laws is hereby amended  
2 by inserting the following after subsection (c) in the definition of “Abuse”:-

3                                   (d) coercive control

4           (b) For the purposes of this section, the following words shall have the following  
5 meanings:

6           "Coercive control" includes, but is not limited to, unreasonably engaging in-person or  
7 through the use of technology any of the following:

8           (i) Isolating the family member, household member, or former partner from friends,  
9 relatives or other sources of support;

10           (ii) Depriving the family member, household member, or former partner of basic  
11 necessities;

12 (iii) Controlling, regulating or monitoring the family, household member, or former  
13 partner movements, communications, daily behavior, finances, economic resources or access to  
14 services;

15 (iv) Compelling the family member, household member, or former partner by force,  
16 threat or intimidation, including, but not limited to, threats based on actual or suspected  
17 immigration status, to (1) engage in conduct from which such family member, household  
18 member, or former partner has a right to abstain, or (2) abstain from conduct that such family  
19 member, household member, or former partner has a right to pursue;

20 (v) Committing or threatening to commit cruelty to animals that intimidates the family  
21 member, household member, or former partner; or

22 (vi) Forced sex acts, or threats of a sexual nature against the family member, household  
23 member, or former partner, including, but not limited to, threatened acts of sexual conduct,  
24 threats based on a person's sexuality or threats to release sexual images or videos.

25 (vii) Intentionally, knowingly, or recklessly causing damage to property so as to  
26 intimidate or attempt to control the behavior of the family member, household member, or  
27 former partner

28 (viii) Closely monitoring the family member, household member, or former partner  
29 activities, communications, and movements

30 (ix) Threatening to publish information or make reports to the police or the authorities  
31 about the family member, household member, or former partner
