Background

On November 28, 2016, Phase I Requirements of Participation (RoP) for Infection Prevention and Control were implemented. Facilities had to establish an Infection Prevention and Control Program with a system for preventing, identifying, reporting, investigating and controlling infections and communicable diseases for residents, staff, volunteers, visitors and other contracted individuals. In addition, an Antibiotic Stewardship program was mandated.

On November 28, 2017, Phase 2 Requirements of Participation for Infection Prevention and Control Programs had further conditions and requirements for the Antibiotic Stewardship program.

On November 28, 2019, Phase 3 Requirements of Participation for a qualified Infection Preventionist took effect.

On March 13, 2020, the President issued an emergency declaration under the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act, 42 U.S.C. 5121-5207 (the "Stafford Act") to declare a national health emergency. During this Public Health Emergency, there has been more specific and frequently updated guidance regarding numerous aspects of Infection Prevention and Control by the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid (CMS) and the Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).
